CITY NOTES

The city was notified by the State Income Tax Division that its net taxable income for Greenbelt residents for 1972 was \$59,339,816. This represents a decline from the previous year, which was \$64,724,120. Dennis Piendak, assistant city manager, attributes this change to the fact that many residents of apartment complexes, such as Brae Brook, Goddard Space Village and Chelsea Woods put "Greenbelt" down on their income tax forms because they live in Greenbelt's postal zone although they actually reside in the municipality of Glendale. Therefore, in previous years Greenbelt was receiving money to which it was not entitled and the state has finally caught up with the mistake, Piendak explained. The net result is that the city will receive less revenue from the state.

The city also received notice that its share of money derived from the federal revenue sharing plan will be less than it has been. Previously the city received \$90,000 a year and during fiscal 1973-74 it expects to receive \$72,000. The reason for this drop is the updated census reports and changing income levels. A further cause is that under federal revisions, counties are going to receive more funds than municipalities. Therefore, the county's share is expected to rise by one quarter million.

The general crew of the Public Works Dept. has completed repairs to Ridge Rd. Ridge, plus Springhill Drive and the driveway of Ridge Rr. Center awaits topping by a contractor.

The special details crew has been painting curbs and crosswalks. The parks crew have been cutting grass and maintaining the golf course and the ballfields. They are also working on Labor Day Festival arrangements.

The city collected 15 1/4 tons of paper last week. The city's aluminum collection is going very poorly. Citizens are urged to bring their aluminum cans — along with the glass — to the containers at the public works building near the lake.
