Dr. James Chong Park New Methodist Minister

On Sunday, July 3, Greenbelt Methodists and their friends will welcome Dr. James Chong Park to the pulpit of the Mowatt United Methodist Church. Dr. Park is replacing the former pastor, Ira Keperling, who has been appointed to a new church in Western Maryland.

Dr. Park has earned five academic degrees, including an M.A. from the Graduate School of Theology, Yon-Sai University, Seoul, South Korea, an M. Div. from the Methodist Theological School in Ohio, and a D. Min. from the Chicago Theological Seminary. In addition to an unusually high level of academic attainment, Dr. Park has a broad pastoral background, having served as a Chaplain in the Korean Navy (1957-1964), as a school Chaplain and Dean (1967-1971) and as pastor of churches in Korea (1964-1967), West Virginia (1976-1981) and Washington, D.C. (1981-present).

Those who have met Dr. Park are impressed by his warmth, dedication, and charm. The congregation invites the community to welcome Dr. Park to Greenbelt on Sunday, July 3.

The congregation of Mowatt wished Ira and Betty Keperling all the best at a farewell reception in their honor on June 19. Rev. Keperling served the church during the initial period of the building of the new sanctuary, and will be missed. Betty Keperling's warmth and fine alto voice will be especially missed by the choir, who grew to love her during her stay in Greenbelt.

All Set for a Glorious 4th

Greenbelt plans a host of special events during the Fourth of July weekend. This year's events will begin on July 2 and last through July 4. The main attraction for the weekend is an hour of fireworks on the Fourth of July. George Smith, director of the Public Works Department which will set up the display, said that this year's show will be purchased again from Columbus Fireworks of Ohio, at a cost of \$2950.

Smith said that this year's display will consist of ground displays, 436 aerial pieces, and a grande finale of 324 shells. The ground display will include eight separate programs of various types. Two of the main ground displays will be a large American flag and a 100-foot "Niagara Falls," which will be a solid curtain of sparklers. Other displays will be the "Sea of Fire," a circular pinwheel with sparklers shooting in four directions, "The Temple of Flora," a triple display with a sparkler spray, and "The Rising Sun."

For the second year in a row, members of the city staff will be launching the fireworks. The group will consist of approximately twelve members chosen from the public works group and from the Park and Recreation Department. In case of rain or extremely high winds, the fireworks will be postponed until the next pleasant evening.

The fireworks display will be preceded this year, as usual, by a concert which will be held in Attick Park (Lake Park) beginning at 7 p.m. The Greenbelt Concert Band of Prince Georges County will be performing and everyone is invited. There is no charge. The concert will continue until dark at which time the fireworks display will begin.

Softball Tournament

Harry Irving, director of the Greenbelt Park and Recreation Department, said that another special attraction for this July 4 weekend will be an adult-league softball tournament, which will begin on July 2 and continue through the weekend. Irving said that the tournament will be especially exciting because the winner will be traveling to Massachusetts for additional games.

All of the recreation parks will be open through the Fourth of July weekend, with different activities taking place on all three days. Some of the weekend's attractions will include men's and womens mixed tennis, played at the Braden Field courts, horse-shoe tournaments at all area parks, and softball and baseball games played by the adult leagues and the city youth organizations.

Safety Hints

Because all of the weekend's activities will attract many visitors to the park areas, the Greenbelt police have offered several helpful hints in hopes of ensuring an enjoyable weekend for everyone. As is customary in Attick Park, no private fireworks, no

dangerous weapons and no alcoholic beverages will be allowed in the area, said Officer Doug Sappington, spokesman for the police department. No fishing is allowed at the Lake Park. People are welcome to picnic in the area throughout the weekend. There will be patrolmen and plain-clothes officers in the area throughout the weekend to offer assistance to park users and to watch for any violations that may occur. Police warn all against bringing any valuables to the park area, if possible. If they must bring them, however, people should keep these valuables with them at all times.

Officer Sappington has also said that no private vehicles will be allowed in the park area. If handicapped persons need assistance to get to the picnic area, however, they may be dropped off and picked up in the park. Drivers of these vehicles must simply notify a patrolman in the area that they will be dropping off a passenger.

Sappington finally suggests that all people "come early and stay late," not only for enjoyment purposes, but for traffic control as well. Sappington said that avoiding driving is highly recommended, but anyone who does drive should be sure not to block any street or park entrances which would impede emergency vehicles.

Smith added, as a last helpful hint, that all people in the park be cautious at the dam end of the lake. At that end there are four observation wells that are used to detect any leaks in the dam that might occur. The wells have pipes that protrude approximately three feet from the ground and are four inches in diameter. Smith said that during the fireworks display these pipes will be behind the line of fire; however, earlier in the day they will not be sealed off in any way. Smith said that although these observation wells do not actually offer any serious safety problems, people in the park should be aware of them and should take precautions.

The recreation, public works and police departments have all expressed their wish that all visitors on the Fourth of July weekend thoroughly enjoy themselves while taking safety precautions at the same time. As Irving said, "There is plenty for spectators and participants to do, not only on July 4 but throughout the entire weekend as well!"

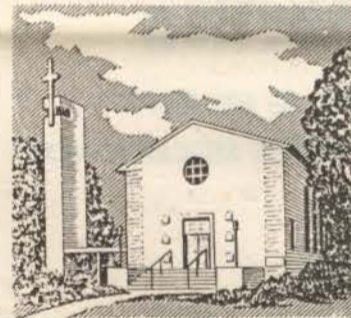
