





### County to Hold Hazardous Waste Clean-Up Sunday

On Sunday, June 24 the Prince Georges County Department of Environmental Resources (DER) will hold a Household Hazardous Waste Clean-Up Day at the Brown Station Road Landfill, 3500 Brown Station Road, Upper Marlboro. County citizens may bring their household hazardous wastes for disposal free of charge between 8 a.m. and 3 p.m. Residents are asked to bring substances in their original containers. The products collected will be disposed of by a licensed hazardous waste disposal firm. The county has made arrangements to accept old phone books for recycling. However, latex-based paints and materials containing dioxin will not be accepted.

Many household cleaners, pesticides, herbicides, lead-based paint and related automobile products contain chemicals that are toxic.

# Police Blotter

On June 7 a nonresident juvenile was arrested for indecent exposure in the 400 block of Ridge Rd. Apparently he stood on a picnic table, pulled down his shorts, and exposed his buttocks. He was released to his mother pending trial.

On June 8 a 36 year old non-resident female was arrested for forging a prescription for valium at People's Drug Store (6000 block Greenbelt Rd.). She appeared before a District Court Commissioner and was released on personal recognizance, pending trial.

Near midnight on June 8, Officer Richard Sullivan went to the security office in Beltway

Plaza because the security personnel were holding a 20 year old male who had been fighting with another man and shouting obscenities. The held man appeared to be heavily intoxicated, and was very uncooperative and combative as Officer Sullivan arrested him. The man was released on a citation for disorderly conduct.

While on patrol in the Beltway Plaza parking lot just after

midnight early June 9, Sgt. Danny Allwang saw a man in a vehicle parked in a firelane hand something to a youth standing outside the vehicle. When the youth noticed Sgt. Allwang, he walked over to a trash receptacle, removed something that looked like the butt of a handgun from the waistband of his pants, and threw it in the trash bin. It turned out to be a .38 caliber handgun. The youth, a 19 year old nonresident, was arrested and charged with possession of a handgun. He appeared before a District Court Commissioner and was incarcerated in lieu of \$5,000

bond. Meanwhile, there were open arrest warrants for the men in the vehicle. Both were turned over to the Prince Georges County Sheriff's Department.

On June 8 a red 1985 Mazda RX7, MD tags XXV 007, and a gray 1986 Toyota Camry, North Carolina tags CWE 3479, were stolen from the parking lot of Beltway Plaza.

## GATE to Broadcast CFG's Cable Forum

Greenbelt Access Television (GATE) will tape for later broadcast the "town meeting" on cable TV service to be held by Citizens for Greenbelt on Wednesday, June 27. To convene in the cafeteria of Eleanor Roosevelt High School at 7:30 p.m., the meeting was prompted by several members' reports of problems with cable service.

The June 27 meeting will feature a panel consisting of Mark Jennings, vice president and general manager of MultiVision, and Victor Nicholson, president of BUSS, Inc. Jennings will address his company's approach to consumer service, and Nicholson will discuss the technical capability of the cable TV medium and its potential effect on consumer service. Audience questions will be encouraged.

Cable TV service is a natural topic for coverage by Greenbelt's public access corporation, according to GATE president Robert Zugby. "Greenbelt Access Television is especially interested in information pertaining to public access technology and assistance," says Zugby, "especially now that GATE is getting its own programming under way." The program will be broadcast at a time to be announced on the public access channel, B-15.
