New Paint, Awnings and Repairs Restoring Center to Its Old Luster

An effort to return the Roosevelt Center in old Greenbelt to its approximate appearance in 1937 is now well underway. Gleaming white exteriors, long subdued as red brick and almost invisible from Crescent Road, now shine in the sun. Other less visible but no less necessary changes, such as the repair of leaking roofs and replacement of windows, are also being carried out.

Nevertheless, our founding fathers and mothers might be perplexed by references in the contract under which the current changes are specified; for in two cases the descriptive model of what should be striven for is the Domino's Pizza Shop. Were there pizza shops in 1937? Certainly not in Greenbelt, and certainly not with fast delivery service. Most people then expected to walk to fill out their grocery lists; and the building in question was at that time home for the Greenbelt police and fire department.

When completed, the commercial buildings will be white with a gray lower section, as currently appears in the pizza shop. Gutters, downspouts, window and door frames and other trim will be dark green, as they were painted in 1937.

Awnings

New awnings will be installed that will appear similar to those when the buildings were new. But in keeping with modern

times, the material will be vinyl, which is said to resemble fabric from a distance. These will be hung somewhat higher than the original awnings, with a steeper slope. They will be fixed, not retractable like the originals.

According to Celia Wilson, the city's Director of Planning, the color for the awnings is expected to be close to the dark green of the trim paint. They will project out from the walls about four feet and will end with a 14-inch scallop. Painted in white on this scallop over each of the doors will be the names of the individual businesses. Although uniform in color, the lettering styles of the signs may vary, as standardized by the parent companies, such as Sovran and Mellon banks and High's. Hidden lighting will illuminate the signs.

Contract Agreement

The contract between the owners of the buildings in the Center, George and Lisa Christacos, and the city of Greenbelt was signed on April 11. In return for the city's support for a Department of Parking and Loading Standards (DPLS) pending before the Planning Board for Prince Georges County, the owners agreed to make certain repairs and improvements to the Center buildings. Christacos hopes to gain approval for construction of a new shop to replace the basement shoe repair facility below the theater, filling in the corner at the east end of the shopping center.

According to county guidelines, such a new commercial building would need to be supported by six new parking

spaces—an obvious impossibility in the Roosevelt Center's limited area. Since the projected new shop would replace one already in use, which would then be abandoned, the city does not foresee additional pressures of any significance on the existing provisions for parking.

Currently the DPLS, which was approved by the Planning Board, is in a 30-day appeal period, after which it will be presented to the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NOPPC).

As part of the process of preparing the contract between Christacos and the city, operators of the various businesses were asked to list whatever problems they had noted with the physical facilities. City attorney Robert Manzi and Christacos then went through the list, designating which of these problems were tenant responsibilities and which were those of the owner.

One larger area of concern to the city, as well as to some of the tenants, involves the loading platforms behind High's and the Greenbelt Carryout. Recently, without input from the city, Christacos enclosed an area of the loading dock behind the restaurant, apparently to replace storage space lost when the new tailor shop took over the small room between the Sovran Bank and the Carryout. The city has asked the firm of consulting engineers to study the general area of the loading docks and to make recommendations concerning access for deliveries and trash removal and possible screening.

The evening's first award, for 1991 Fireman of the Year, was awarded to Bob Pergola. He was honored for his personal dedication and service to the Fire Department on his 26 years of service. Pergola has shown a level of commitment which ranges from running calls, fixing broken apparatus, and taking night duty when needed, to helping with fund raising. President Ed Hughes cited: "The dedication with which he approaches his membership in the Department epitomizes the spirit of volunteerism."

Thanking the Legion for the Certificate of Commendation Pergola said, "That's what volunteering is about."

"Carl exemplifies the qualities we all would like to see in a police officer. On top of that, he is a genuinely decent person and someone truly deserving of the honor of being named Officer of the Year."

Upon receiving the award Schinner first thanked his wife, Pam, and commented that, "Part of it is the department . . . we stick together." Schinner is a four-year veteran of the force and has two children.

Greenbelt Mayor Gil Weidenfeld presented proclamations to both Pergola and Schinner for, "Exemplifying those qualities we most like to see." He also thanked Cmdr. Sam Hoffberg for recognizing the policemen and firemen.

Chairman of the Prince Georges County Council Richard Castaldi also presented a proclamation to the honorees. Council member Castaldi noted his experiences of growing up in Greenbelt.

Representing State Senator Leo Green, who was unable to attend, Greenbelt City Council member Thomas White read resolutions sponsored by Green in the Maryland Senate in honor of Pergola and Schinner.

Surplus Food Program In Greenbelt June 12, 13

On Wednesday and Thursday, June 12 and 13, the City will distribute food as part of the Prince Georges County Surplus Food Program. Canned applesauce, canned vegetarian beans, canned green beans, butter, flour, cornmeal, canned pork, raisins and rice will be available for all eligible persons. Food may be picked up on either day from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Eligibility requirements are: (1) participation in a public assistance program or in Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) (Photo ID required), or (2) participation in the Food Stamp Program (Photo ID), or (3) participation in Medicaid Program (Medicaid Card), or (4) Maryland Energy Assistance Program (letter) or (5) an income that is lower than \$9,420 for one person, \$12,630 for two people, \$15,840 for three people or \$19,050 for four people.

After his retirement he worked for Bara-King Photography, in Cheverly, using his ability to speak Hungarian with clients. Several other part-time jobs included working at Radio Shack in the Greenway Center and Discount Record and Tape where he joked he was the "stereo expert."

Jim's hobbies included cooking. In fact, his friends considered him to be a gourmet cook.

His continued interest in architecture and art led to his taking summer elderhostel courses in architecture at both Cambridge and Oxford Universities.

Jim liked to travel and in the past few years went to Hungary and parts of Russia where his family came from, also to France and Spain.

An avid reader, Jim could be found several nights a week in Greenbelt library where he was never too busy to stop and talk or help someone.

In Greenbelt he served on the Greenbelt Homes, Inc. (GHI) Audit Committee for two terms, from 1978 to 1980. He had been a volunteer proofreader for the Greenbelt News Review and had recently begun attending the senior citizens' exercise classes at the Youth Center.

His marriage to Nancy Whittemore Simon ended in divorce.

Survivors include his daughter Margaret, of the District of Columbia; Andrew Herbert, Fishkill, N.Y., and brothers Albert, Greensburg, Pa., and John of McKeesport.

A memorial service will be held on Monday, June 17 at 1 p.m., at Cedar Lane Unitarian Church, 9601 Cedar Lane, Bethesda.

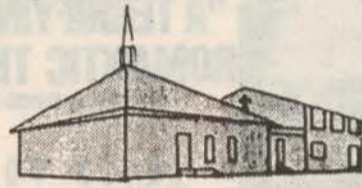

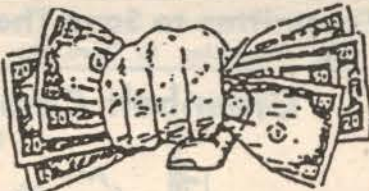
