Spotlight on the Arts

The witty & sophisticated comedy-drama "Jigsaws" opens up for a three-week run at the Greenbelt Arts Center. The play portrays a year in the life of five women in one family: a grandmother, her two daughters, and two granddaughters. Their story is a charming and poignant one focusing on the relationships between the generations. The play touches on such topics as suicide, divorce, alcoholism, homosexuality, unemployment, death in the family, and how many runs do you get for hitting the henhouse on a fly in the annual south Florida Christmas Baseball Game. It is a realistic, touching, and sympathetic look at women and at the way they see the men in their lives.

The play is directed by the team of Jo and Steve Blais. The all-female cast consists of GAC regulars Maria Tousignant, Judy Holland, and Sandy Hamlin, and two newcomers to the GAC Stage Shannon Johnston and Jennifer Salmons. Bob Thompson designed and built the brilliant set, which has some real technical challenges.

Reserve early for this show, as tickets are already going fast. Please note the Sunday matinee is the first weekend of the show so as not to conflict with Fathers Day. Play dates are Fridays and Saturdays, June 10-11, June 17-18, and June 24-25 at 8 p.m., and Sunday, June 12 at 2 p.m. Group rates for groups of 10 or more are available at a slight reduction. Barbara Simon Honored

Local artist and teacher Barbara McGee Simon was among those honored by the Prince Georges Arts Council at a luncheon on May 26 at Martins Crosswinds.

Cosponsored by the Journal newspapers the event honored businesses that contribute to the Arts Council. Their gifts are passed on as grants to the arts community.

Al Maitland, director of the county Arts Council, also honored people who contributed in the field of arts in some outstanding manner. This year the emphasis is on the growing need for more arts education programs for children. Simon was chosen for her work in this area.

Funded by a grant from the Arts Council, she taught clay sculpture to five classes of 30 children each at the Greenbelt Elementary School. Works created by the children were on display this past winter at the Greenbelt branch library. Maitland cited this program and stressed the need for expansion of such classes throughout the county.

An arts teacher for 12 years, Simon is a professional artist currently doing water color drawings. She has taught at the Greenbelt Recreation Department and has also given much time and effort to local arts interests. She chairs the Arts Advisory Committee for the City of Greenbelt. She cofounded (and is president of) the Greenbelt Visual Arts Coalition, which was formed to work with the city to create a center for the arts at the new Community Center, and she is vice-chair of the Community Center Task Force.

Daughter of long-time resident Dorothy McGee, she lives on Ridge Road with husband Tom, head of Adult Services at the Greenbelt branch library, and daughters Julia, 17, and Nora, 8.

Last Chance To Change Party

State Law requires that prior to any regular primary election, a registered voter may not change party affiliation or change to or from a decline, after 9 p.m. on the Monday which is 12 weeks or 84 days before the primary election.

Maryland voters have until 9 p.m. Monday, June 20 to change their political party affiliation. The Gubernatorial Primary Election is to be held on Tuesday, September 13.

New Bus Routes Deciphered In Springhill Lake Service

The best bus service in Greenbelt is located in part of Springhill Lake. Five buses travel on Cherrywood Lane to and from the Greenbelt Metro station, one of which makes a circuit through Springhill Lake.

It has been six months since the Greenbelt Metro station opened. At that time bus routes and times were changed dramatically in this part of the county. This article is the first of three discussing the changed bus routes in the city of Greenbelt and nearby areas.

Most of the buses that go to the Greenbelt Metro station travel on Cherrywood Lane. Five buses run at least once an hour during week days, so that at any hour during the week at least five buses will travel to the Greenbelt Metro station along Cherrywood Lane, and also in the opposite direction on Cherrywood Lane, to other points. The buses are: R12, T15/16/17, C2, R3, R3.

For example, if you wanted to take a bus to the metro and get to work in Washington, D.C. by 9 a.m., the following are the times when buses travel Cherrywood Lane: 7:34 a.m., 7:42, 7:43, 7:47, 7:53, 7:56, 8:03, 8:07, 8:15, and 8:21 (times calculated from the last stop before Springhill Lake from the bus schedules).

Bus service to other points besides the Greenbelt Metro station is also excellent for those who can catch a bus on Cherrywood Lane. Three buses travel to other parts of Greenbelt (C2, R12, T15/16/17; four buses to

Beltway Plaza (C2, R12, T15/16/17, R3); two buses to the New Carrollton Metro station (R12, and T15/16/17); and two buses at or near Doctor's hospital (R12, and T15/16/17). See box for further destinations and bus routes.

R12

One bus runs through all of Springhill Lake. This is the same bus, R12, on the same route, that this bus has taken through Springhill Lake for years. Going towards the Greenbelt Metro station, the bus enters Springhill Lake from Greenbelt Road at Edmonston Road, turns onto Springhill Drive, onto Springhill Lane, then BreezeWood Drive, then Cherrywood Lane south to Beltway Plaza, then north on Cherrywood Lane to the metro station.

This bus runs six days a week, twice an hour most of the day, except during mid-day. It runs once an hour on Saturday. Bus schedules are available at the metro station and the Greenbelt library.

What is Source?

Mr. Giese's statement that the GHI board "had been made aware of the (1992 environmental) report" (June 2 issue) is false. What is his source for this unattributed statement?

The issue is very important to GHI because it involves an environmental study the results of which were withheld by previous management from some of the board members who authorized it and from the members who paid thousands of dollars to have it done by a consultant.

This report was a prerequisite for refinancing an \$18 million loan we are paying 9.16% interest on. The refinancing never occurred. The board had hoped to take advantage of the very low interest rates of a couple of years ago. During the recent GHI elections, it was said that the savings could have been as high as a million dollars.

Gretchen Overdurff, the new general manager, had the report delivered to board members in preparation for the meeting

Giese covered. During the meeting, I was one of the board members who charged that the report had been withheld for two years. A former board member said the report had been discussed at board meetings. I challenged her to produce the minutes and I am still waiting for them. I also challenge Mr. Giese to produce the minutes or any source for his statement.

Mr. Giese certainly did not ask me any questions after the meeting. To who did he talk? I call on the News Review to print a retraction of this serious error.

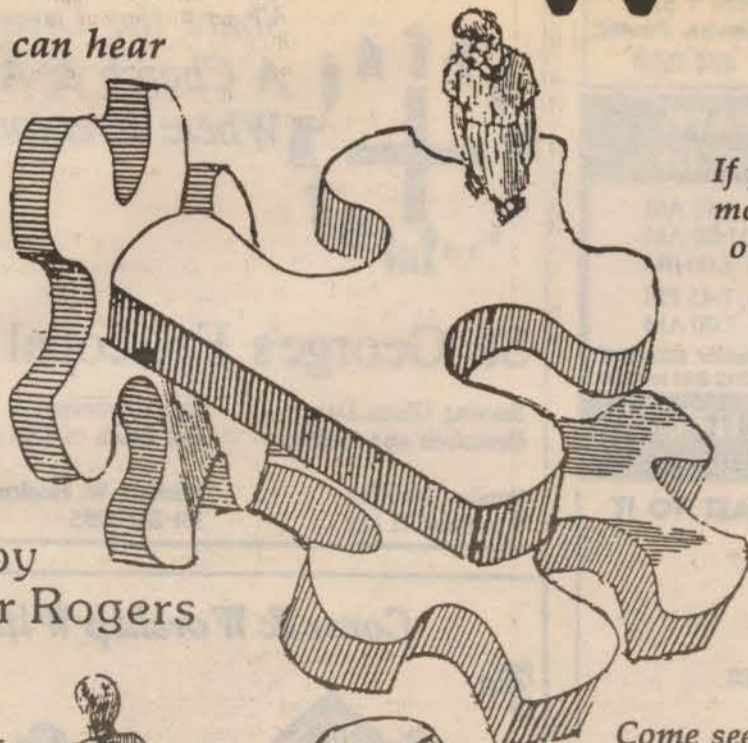

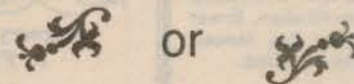

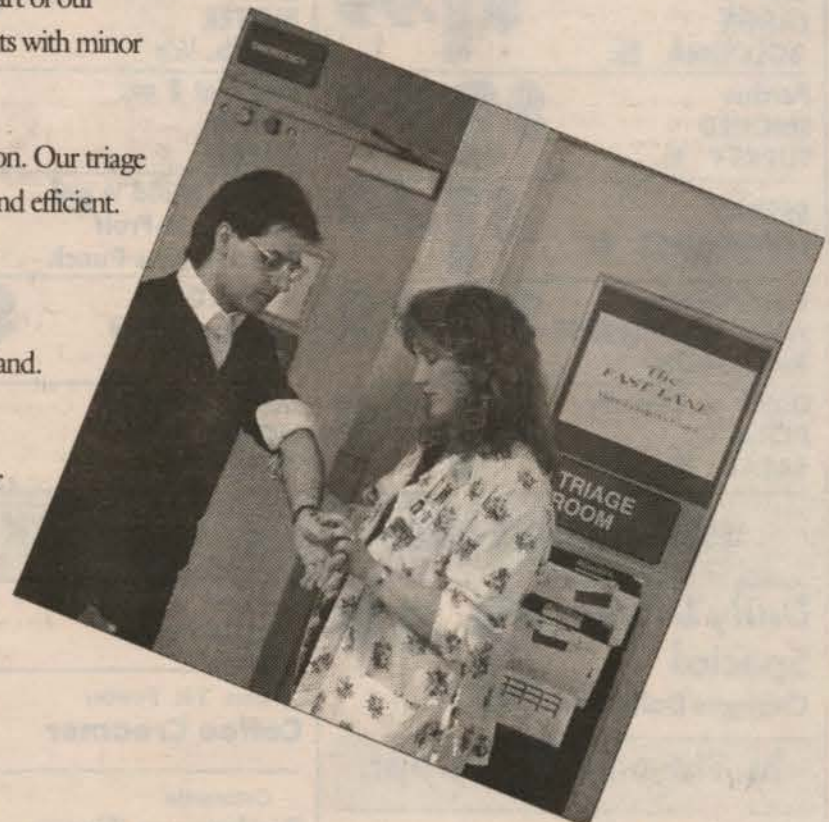
